- Life skills
- Work programs
- · Around the clock care
- Counselling
- Social supports
- Increased screening for mental health concerns at time of admittance



Substance Smuggling

Access to

- OAT is only available to individuals who have previously been prescribed it prior to incarceration
- Waitlists
- Staff stigma
- Recovery programs are insufficient

Barriers include:


- · Lack of supports Not being taken
- seriously Conflicting schedules
- Stigmatization
- · Lack of awareness (Tordal et al, 2024)

Treatment

Trauma-Informed Approach

- Strength-based practices
- within prisons Majority of people incarcerated have comorbid mental health concerns
- · Educating prison staff on being trauma-informed to decrease stigma
- Increased rehabilitation rather than strict punishments like isolation
